City Proclaims Rotary Polio Plus Day in Parksville

Parksville, BC - Rotary International is the world's first and one of the largest non-profit service organizations with 1.2 million members serving in over 32,000 clubs in 200 countries worldwide. The City of Parksville is presently well-served by two Rotary Clubs; the Rotary Club of Parksville AM and the Rotary Club of Parksville.

Acting Mayor Chris Burger received a request from the Rotary Club of Parksville AM to proclaim February 23 as "Rotary Polio Plus Day" in Parksville.
