## April is Daffodil Month in Parksville

Parksville, BC — Acting Mayor Chris Burger has proclaimed April 2011 as Canadian Cancer Society's **Daffodil Month** and April 27, 2011 as **Daffodil Day** in the City of Parksville.

During April, Canadians across the country are being asked to wear the daffodil pin throughout the month. Last year, the BC and Yukon division of the Canadian Cancer Society piloted the daffodil campaign and due to its success, it is now being launched nationally this year.
