PARKSVILLE, BC: In recognition of Youth Week BC, City Council recently conducted a Mayor for a Day Essay contest. Rebeka Thompson a 17 year old, grade 11 student at Ballenas Secondary School is the author of the winning essay and will serve as Honorary Mayor for a Day. Emma Deering, a 13 year old grade 8 student from Springwood Middle School was chosen as Deputy Mayor.

This is the second year Parksville Council has provided an opportunity for youth to speak their minds during the *Mayor for a Day* contest. Chosen by Council, the essays were passionate, honest and thoughtful and the concerns brought forward by the students are very similar to the issues faced by Council.
