It connects to the Community Safety Net website, where kids can enter online contests and win great prizes.

The materials have been provided thanks to the generous support of 55 local businesses and organizations whose names are listed in the books. An excellent resource for parents, the programs contain important information and websites for more help.

House fires are the third leading cause of death among children — mostly as a result of smoke inhalation. Kids start 30% of these fires. Such sobering statistics illustrate the need for fire safety education among young people.
