Parksville Adopts Region-wide Watering Restrictions

At the March 17 meeting, Parksville Council gave final adoption to a bylaw to change the City's watering restrictions. The change provides for a coordinated approach with the other water service providers within the Regional District of Nanaimo.

Following the drought and elevated levels of water restrictions experienced in 2015, it became apparent differing definitions of watering restrictions created confusion when communicating with residents. By creating a common framework across the entire region, customers within each water service area will have better clarity on watering restrictions and the coordinated framework will provide a consistent definition. Each provider will determine the appropriate level, based on the needs of the individual system.

The City is a partner in the Regional District of Nanaimo's Team WaterSmart program which will host a central website specific to the region's watering restrictions. This new website will show each water provider and the current restriction stage so the public and media will have a consistent, up-to-date location to retrieve information [Teamwatersmart.ca]. This new website is in addition to the information posted under water restrictions on the City of Parksville website at parksville.ca [Quicklinks/Water Restrictions]

Later this month, the City will mail information about the new water restriction stages to residents along with utility billings. The pamphlet is also are available from City offices.

Between April and October, water restrictions are necessary to meet current water supply demands for drinking, fire protection and irrigation. The City will implement water restrictions in the form of four stages.

Stage 1 April and October consists of night-time lawn watering only, 7 pm to 7 am
Stage 2 May through September limits use to "even and odd day" watering.


Stage 3 Voluntary reductions on top of Stage 2

Stage 4 Bans non-essential water use

Please note that vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions and businesses which require water for operations are also exempt.

New Water Restrictions for City of Parksville Water Service System Bylaw 1320

Recent changes to the City of Parksville's watering restrictions provide for a coordinated approach with the other water service providers within the Regional District of Nanaimo. Following the drought and elevated water restriction levels experienced in 2015, it was apparent differing watering restriction definitions created confusion for residents and businesses. With a common framework across the region, customers within each water service area will have greater clarity on watering restrictions. While the definitions of water restriction stages will be consistent across the region, each water purveyor determines the level specific to their needs.



Stage 1 (April and October) consists of night-time watering only, 7 pm to 7 am.

Stage 2 (May through September) limits use to "even and odd day" watering.

Stage 3 requests further voluntary reductions prior to implementing a ban, enabling residents to choose where they cut back. Focus is on lawns and an opportunity to defer a comprehensive watering ban.

Stage 4 bans non-essential water use such as automated sprinkling, vehicle washing and outdoor surface washing when supplies are stressed.

Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions, even Stage 4.

Hand-watering — delivering water by hose with spring-loaded nozzle shutoff device or handheld container.

Businesses which require water for operations, essential municipal sports fields and nurseries are exempt.
